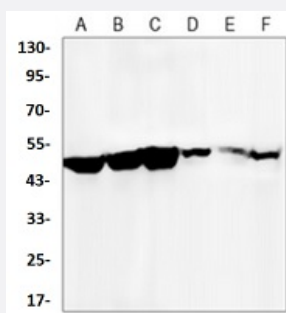

Storage Instruction

Store at 4°C short term.
Aliquot and store at -20°C long term.
Avoid freeze-thaw cycles.
