

Gene Summary	This gene is thought to play an important role in calcium homeostasis. The gene is expressed fro m two promoters and undergoes extensive alternative splicing. The encoded set of proteins share varying amounts of overlap near their N-termini but have substantial variations in their C-terminal d omains resulting in distinct functional properties. The longest isoforms (a and f) include a C-termin al Aspartyl/Asparaginyl beta-hydroxylase domain that hydroxylates aspartic acid or asparagine re sidues in the epidermal growth factor (EGF)-like domains of some proteins, including protein C, c oagulation factors VII, IX, and X, and the complement factors C1R and C1S. Other isoforms differ primarily in the C-terminal sequence and lack the hydroxylase domain, and some have been locali zed to the endoplasmic and sarcoplasmic reticulum. Some of these isoforms are found in comple xes with calsequestrin, triadin, and the ryanodine receptor, and have been implicated in metastasis. [provided by RefSeq
